2020 CSCC Award for Outstanding Contribution to Clinical Chemistry Sponsored by Siemens Healthineers

Edgard Delvin, BSc, MSc, PhD, FCACB, FAACC



It is the Society's pleasure to award the CSCC Award for Outstanding Contributions to Clinical Chemistry, sponsored by Siemens Healthineers, to **Dr. Edgard Delvin**.

Dr. Delvin received his PhD from the Université de Montréal in 1969. He then undertook post-doctoral training in immunology and biochemical genetics from 1969 to 1973. In 1973 Edgard joined the Shriners Hospital for Children and was a principal investigator and associate professor in the Departments of Physiology and Experimental Surgery & Physiology at McGill University. In 1992, the University of Montreal recruited him to chair the Department of Clinical Biochemistry at the University-affiliated Sainte Justine Hospital. He was also appointed as full Professor of Biochemistry in the Department of

Biochemistry of the Faculty of Medicine. He appointed associate Director of Ste-Justine Research Centre from 2002-2006.

Edgard has demonstrated excellence in all areas of Clinical Biochemistry. He is a well-respected researcher in the areas of pediatric nutrition, Vitamin D metabolism, and the definition of hormone and lipid profiles in healthy Children. He was a leading contributor to the establishment of the CALIPER database of pediatric reference intervals. Dr. Delvin has published more than 375 papers and has been cited roughly 10,000 times. For his contributions, Edgard received the CSCC Award for Research Excellence in 2003.

Dr. Delvin has made very significant contributions to the dissemination of knowledge in our field and the promotion of our profession. He served as President of the Ordre des chimistes du Québec from 1983-1988. From 2006 to 2012, he served as Editor—in-Chief for the Society's journal, Clinical Biochemistry, and the special editions editor until 2017. He was Editor-in-chief of the IFCC eNewsletter from 2006 untill 2012 and is on the eIFCCJ editorial board. He chaired the IFCC Committee for Public Relations (C-PR) and served as Vice-Chair of the Communications and Publications Division Executive Committee. From 2001 to 2004, Edgard served on the Board of the Canadian Academy of Clinical Biochemistry, of which he is a founding fellow. In 2011 he was elected corresponding member of the French Académie nationale de medicine.

Colleagues have commented on his extensive knowledge base, professionalism, and availability to clinical colleagues.

For these, and many other significant contributions to our profession the CSCC is proud to recognize Dr. Delvin with the 2020 award for Outstanding Contributions to Clinical Chemistry.
