## **Jack Gauldie**

Jack Gauldie is currently Professor & Chairman, Department of Pathology and Molecular Medicine, McMaster University, Hamilton, Ontario. Dr. Gauldie holds the title of University Professor, Department of Pathology and Molecular Medicine and is the John Bienenstack Chair of Molecular Medicine at McMaster University.

Dr. Gauldie was born in Greenock, Scotland and received his B.Sc. from McMaster University in 1964. In 1968, he received the Ph. D. degree in biological chemistry from University College in London, UK. Jack became a fellow of the Canadian Academy of Clinical Biochemistry in 1984 and a fellow in clinical immunology of the CACB in 1995.

Dr. Gauldie has published over 275 papers in prominent international journals. He has presented more than 345 abstracts at major national and international congresses to date.

Jack currently sits on the editorial board of many prominent biomedical journals and is an *ad hoc* reviewer for several leading publications. He is on the editorial board of the Journal of *Immunology, Journal of Interferon and Cytokine Research, Journal of Clinical Investigation, International Journal of Biochemistry and Cell Biology, Cytokine, American Journal of Respiratory Cell and Molecular Biology* and the *American Journal of Physiology: Lung Cellular and Molecular Physiology.* 

Dr. Gauldie serves on the grant committees of many organizations including the Arthritis Society and the Canadian Institutes for Health Research a) Groups Peer Review Committee and b) Canada Research Chairs Committee of Reviewers.

Jack Gauldie has supervised 13 M.Sc. students, 16 Ph. D. students and 25 post-doctoral fellows. Professionally, he has helped organize many national and international meetings. Jack is organizing committee chair for the 13<sup>th</sup> International Colloquium on Lung Fibrosis being held in Banff in October 2004

From 1999 to 2004, Dr. Gauldie has received research contract and grant funding from many organizations including AstraZeneca, Baxter Healthcare Corp., Breast Cancer Society of Canada, CIHR, Geron Corporation, Leukemia Research Fund of Canada, National Institutes of Health (USA), and Roche (Boehringer-Mannheim GmBH).
